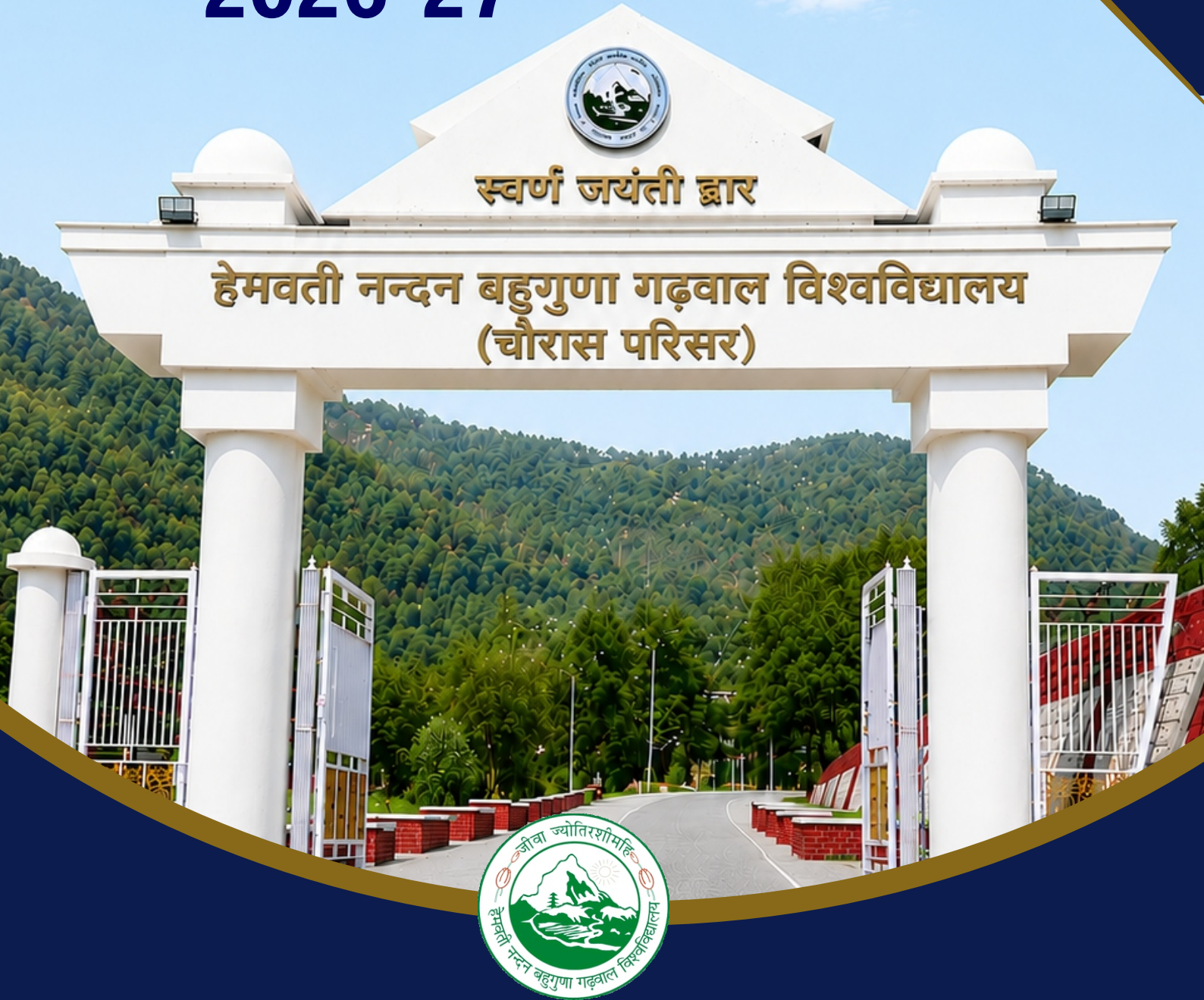

## **Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna**

**(25 April 1919 - 17 March 1989)**

Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna, born in Devbhumi Uttarakhand, by virtue of his life of an eternal Karma yogi and a statesman, lifted the glory of Garhwal and India up to the supernal heights. He received his early education from Garhwal region and later on shaped his academic and political career from Allahabad University. Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna was a man of commitment and firmly believed in multi-religious, multi-lingual, and multi-ethnic fabric of Indian society. Risen in politics from the lowest strata this patriotic politician eternally detached himself from all petty selfish motives and refused to compromise with fundamentalism and regionalism.

The history of his political life is full of twist and turns but despite the blows of time and fate, he steered the wheel of his life like the ever-flowing Ganges. Hemwati Nandan, 'the son of the mountains' proved true to his name. He never lost his cool even in the odds emerging off and on in his life. He was one of those few politicians in India who advocated corruption free, neat, and clean administration. He held important ministerial positions for long terms in the Union and State Government.

It was his firm conviction that the autonomy of the democratic institutions should be respected and maintained by the executive machinery. He always emphasized upon the autonomy of the Universities. During his tenure as the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh he took special care to maintain the dignity of the status of the Vice-Chancellors. The tremendous love and concern which he manifested towards the teaching community is remembered by teachers to this day with gratitude. All of us will always remember him for his efficient administration and strong commitment, he showed for the all-round development of Garhwal University. Adopting the name of Shri Bahuguna ji for the University, and thereby overwhelmingly portraying its distinctive identity, we salute the late Sri Hemwati Nandan Bahuguna, the true son of the soil.

# **HEMVATI NANDAN BAHUGUNA GARHWAL UNIVERSITY**

## **An Educational Legacy in the Heart of the Himalayas**

Founded on December 1, 1973, Hemvati Nandan Bahuguna Garhwal University was originally established as Garhwal University following a historic grassroots movement that advocated accessible higher education for the Garhwal region of Uttarakhand. In 1989, the University was renamed in honour of the visionary leader Shri Hemvati Nandan Bahuguna, reflecting his enduring commitment to inclusive development and regional empowerment.

The University attained the status of a Central University in 2009 under the Central Universities Act, marking a significant milestone in its journey toward academic distinction. Since then, HNB Garhwal University has emerged as a premier institution of higher education in India, recognised for its dedication to academic excellence, regional development, and community engagement. Its diverse academic programmes, vibrant research culture, and inclusive outreach initiatives have contributed to its growing Pan-India character, attracting students and scholars from across the country.

Nestled in the Himalayan foothills of Uttarakhand, the University functions as both a residential and affiliating institution of higher learning. Its jurisdiction extends across the seven districts of the Garhwal region through its headquarters in Srinagar and three campuses: Birla Campus (Srinagar), with an extension at Chauras; Dr. Bejawada Gopal Reddy (BGR) Campus (Pauri); and Swami Ram Teerth (SRT) Campus (Badshahi Thaul, Tehri). In addition, 64 affiliated colleges /institutes further expand the University's academic reach across the region.

Accredited with an 'A' Grade by NAAC, the University has implemented the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 since the Academic Year 2022. The 50 departments under 11 Schools of Study across the University campuses offer academic programmes in diverse disciplines, including region-specific courses tailored to the Himalayan region's socio-economic and ecological needs. At present, 14 undergraduate, 60 postgraduate (2 year), 32 postgraduate (1 year), 01 dual degree integrated (4 year), 01 integrated (5 year), 05 postgraduate diploma, 03 diploma, 01 certificate, and 05 other programmes of study are offered across the three campuses. Additionally, doctoral research opportunities are available in 48 disciplines.

Beyond academics, the University actively promotes holistic student development through extension and co-curricular activities such as NSS, NCC, cultural exchanges, sporting events and various Government of India initiatives including Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, Viksit Bharat Youth Parliament, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, and Swachhta Hi Seva Hai Abhiyan. In the academic year 2025–26, the University enrolled more than 45,000 students, including 11,251 students across its campuses.

HNB Garhwal University is more than a centre of learning—it is a vibrant space where ideas flourish, diverse traditions converge, and future leaders are nurtured. Set amidst a serene natural environment, the University fosters critical inquiry, sustainable thinking, and social responsibility. As a confluence of tradition and innovation, it remains committed to advancing knowledge that serves both national aspirations and the unique needs of India's mountain communities.

Applicant should read the Admission Prospectus carefully regarding the eligibility of the programme. For example, for those who apply for LL.M, should have LL.B. in bachelor degree.

5. If you want to apply for more than one programme, repeat the step 4 only. Steps 1 to 3 need not to be repeated. You need to pay application fee as per the instruction issued by the University. Applicant cannot apply for more than three (03) programmes.

**Note:** Students are required to complete the registration process on or before the specified deadline to ensure uninterrupted access to academic services.

After the successful registration, the concerned authority of the University will review and verify the submitted application forms. In accordance with the admission policy for the academic session, the Admission Committee constituted for various Programmes/Courses shall shortlist the eligible applicants and prepare merit lists for admission. The shortlisted applicants are then required to log in to the Admission Portal and complete the Admission Process by paying the prescribed fee online.

The Student Life Cycle (SLC) module on the SAMARTH e-Gov Portal at Hemvati Nandan Bahuguna Garhwal University, Srinagar Garhwal, Uttarakhand offers a comprehensive digital platform to manage a student's academic journey from their Admission to the award of the Degree/Diploma. This system ensures transparency, efficiency, and accessibility to both students as well as the University Administrators.

#### Key Features of the Student Life Cycle at HNBGU

1. Mandatory Registration for New Students
  - All newly admitted students in undergraduate, postgraduate, diploma, PG diploma, and integrated courses are required to register on the SAMARTH Student Portal.

- Use your assigned enrollment number to initiate registration.
  - After registration, link your Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) ID with your SAMARTH account.
2. Academic Management
    - Access to course details, examination schedules, results, and credit scores.
    - Ability to fill out examination forms and download admit cards online.
  3. Feedback Mechanism
    - Students can provide feedback on courses and faculty through the Feedback Management System (FMS), enhancing the quality of education.
  4. Integration with Learning Management System (LMS)  
Seamless access to the university's LMS for course materials, assignments, and other learning resources.

## GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

1. The applicants seeking admission to a Programme of Study offered by the University are advised to read all the admission rules and fee structure carefully before filling up the admission form and electing subject(s) of choice.
2. The applicants must attach Migration Certificate/Transfer Certificate and Character Certificate, issued by the institution last attended (in case of candidates passing the qualifying examination as regular student) and Character Certificate issued by a Gazetted Officer/ MP/ MLA/ The Principal or Proctor of a Degree or Post Graduate College (in case of passing the qualifying examination as private candidate or in the distance learning mode) in original and self-attested copies/authenticated photocopies of mark sheets and certificates/ degrees of all preceding examinations passed, merit-certificates, sports certificates and other relevant documents along with the admission form.
3. The applicants seeking the benefit of reservation of seats in admission to the various programmes offered by the University available to persons belonging to the SC/ST/OBC/EWS/Persons with Disabilities, etc. categories, shall attach the attested/authenticated photocopy of the certificate issued by the SDM/DM/CMO, as the case may be, in the prescribed format.
4. The Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016 and UGC's Accessibility Guidelines Standards for Higher Education Institutions and Universities (2022) mandate inclusive education for all forms of disabilities including Specific Learning Disabilities (SLDs).
5. The applicants must affix latest and self-attested coloured passport-sized photograph in the space provided in the admission form.
6. As per the existing rules, the Admission Committee will consider a student for admission on the basis of the verification of the attested documents submitted by applicant.
7. The applicants must appear personally before the Admission Committee along with all the original certificates and testimonials for the verification of her/his academic records and identity.
8. The applicants are advised to submit their admission applications in the prescribed admission form well before the last date. No admission application shall be entertained after the given due date. However, persons rehabilitated from Kashmir shall be allowed a relaxation of up to one month in respect of the said last date.
9. Incomplete admission applications or admission applications not filled in the prescribed admission format or admission applications without required documents mentioned in the above instruction (2), shall not be entertained for admission.
10. The various professional and vocational programmes/courses offered by the University in self-financed mode in the campuses shall be made available in a campus only if ten or more applicants seek admission to the same. In case, the number of applicants seeking admission to the said programmes/courses in a campus is less than ten in respect of a particular programme, the same shall not be made available in the campus concerned. However, subject to their fulfilling the merit criteria and the availability of seats, applicants desirous of pursuing the concerned programme would be given an opportunity to join it in the campus in which it is available.
11. Admission to the various programmes offered by the University shall be granted on the basis of either the performance of the applicant in the entrance examination held for the purpose, or the counseling held in pursuance of the declaration of the results of the various common admission tests/examinations, such as, CUET, UET, NCET, JEE Main or the relative merit of the various applicants. The method to be employed for granting admissions may vary from School to School and Programme to Programme.
12. The manner of determining the relative merit of the applicants seeking admission to a Programme in which admission is to be granted on the basis of merit shall be decided and notified by the appropriate authority/officer of the University in view of the number of seats fixed for the Programme/Course and the same shall be taken to be the basis for granting/denying admission to the Programme/Course concerned in respect of all the three campuses of the University.
13. The number of admissions to be granted to a Programme/Course offered by the University shall not exceed the number of seats assigned to and available in the Programme/Course. The number of seats fixed for a

Programme/Course in a given academic session shall not be increased during the session under any circumstances.

14. No applicant shall be admitted to any Programme/Course offered by the University after the expiry of the notified last date for admissions to the same and the said last date of admission shall not be extended even if all the available seats in a given Programme/Course may not have been filled and some seats might be vacant after the expiry of the last date of admission.
15. If the applicant produces false document or misleads the University with false facts, the University shall have the right to deny admission or cancel the admission granted to an applicant without any further clarification.
16. Every applicant granted admission shall deposit the prescribed one-time annual fee, tuition fee for 6 months/12 months, examination fee, etc., before the notified last date of admission. If the said fee is not deposited by the last date, the admission granted to student will stand cancelled automatically.
17. For UG classes (1<sup>st</sup> semester of B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. etc.), change of subject is allowed only on the availability of seats in the concerned subject within 15 days from the date of admission on the recommendation of Head of the Department and Dean of the School. However, such change shall be allowed on the fulfillment of eligibility, availability of seats, based on merit and through the counseling board for the Course/Subject.
18. Subject to the restrictions regarding permissible combinations of elective subjects at the UG level specified in this Admission Prospectus, a student seeking admission to B.A. or B.Sc. 1<sup>st</sup> Semester may choose one or more elective subjects from different Schools; and in such events, a student shall be for administrative purposes, deemed to be the student of the School from which she/he might have chosen the majority of the subjects offered. However, in cases where a student may choose one subject each from three different schools, she/he shall be required to indicate in the admission form the name of the School under the administrative supervision of which she/he might desire to pursue the programme concerned.
19. The applicants admitted to a School in accordance with the provisions of instruction mentioned above in point no 17, shall not be permitted to change their preference of School indicated in the admission form once admission is granted.
20. Fractional rounding up shall not be admissible for calculating the minimum eligibility criteria, i.e., 44.9% or 39.9% shall not be treated as 45% or 40%, respectively.
21. Campus transfer shall not be allowed in 1<sup>st</sup> year of admission.

## IMPORTANT ADMISSION RULES

1. Applicants who might have appeared in compartment/supplementary examination may apply for admission. However, such applicants shall be considered for admission subject to clearing their compartment/supplementary examination, only if they might have submitted their admission forms well in time and their final result might have been declared before preparing final merit list for admission.
2. For admission to B.A. LLB., LL.B., and LL.M. minimum qualifications will be as per the latest guidelines of Bar Council of India.
3. Applicants shall have to submit all the documents mentioned in the preceding instruction (2) along with the admission form. In addition, applicants who might have passed the qualifying examination from a University other than the H.N.B. Garhwal University shall have to submit a Migration Certificate issued by the last concerned University within one month of the date on which they might be granted admission, failing which their admission shall stand cancelled automatically.
4. Applicants in full-time employment shall be considered for admission to a Programme/Course of the University only upon submission of a No Objection Certificate (NOC) issued by their employer with sanctioning of leave for total course period.
5. Five per cent (5%) campus weightage will be granted in PG Programmes to the students who have passed their UG examination from Hemvati Nandan Bahuguna Garhwal University.
6. The admission in Sports Quota will be given as five per cent (5%) seats (Supernumerary) of the total number of seats in each programme.
7. Seats shall be reserved for SC/ST/OBC candidates in all Programmes/Courses of the University in accordance with the Central Education Institutions (Reservation in Admission) Act 2006 of the Government of India, i.e., 15% for SC, 7.5% for ST and 27% for OBC candidates. In addition, horizontal reservation in each category shall be 30% for women, 5% for defense personnel and/or their dependents, 5% for persons with disabilities and 2% for dependents of freedom fighters. In case of OBC (Central list of OBCs) category candidates, they are required to produce OBC Non-Creamy Layer Certificate (OBC- NCL) issued by Competent Authority. A valid OBC-NCL certificate, issued after April 1, 2026, must be submitted at the time of counseling/admission. [https://ncbc.nic.in/User\\_Panel/CentralListStateView.aspx](https://ncbc.nic.in/User_Panel/CentralListStateView.aspx)
8. As per OM No. F. No.: 12-4/2019-U1 Dated 17.01.2019 of MHRD New Delhi, 10% of the total seats shall be reserved for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) from 2019-2020. Candidates from EWS category are required to produce EWS certificate with validity at the time of admission.
9. Applicants who might have been detained or have failed in a class or might be drop-outs shall not be granted regular admission. However, they shall be permitted to appear at the annual/semester examinations for the class concerned as ex-students. The expression 'drop-outs' means, students who might have attended their classes regularly throughout an academic session after being granted admission, but could have not been able to appear for the annual/semester examinations on account of a valid and acceptable reason. However, only such students will treated to be ex-student, who might have put in the prescribed minimum attendance during the academic session concerned and had been allotted a roll number mentioned on the duly issued admit card for the annual/semester examination of the University.
10. Applicant who might have been punished for adopting unfair means in an examination or convicted by a Court of Law for a crime committed by her/him, or expelled/rusticated by the University or found guilty of indulging in ragging in the institution(s) attended by her/him prior to seeking admission to the University shall not be granted admission to any Programme/Course of the University.
11. Students indulging in activities in the campus that are considered to be improper, unwarranted, amounting to a breach of discipline or a violation of the rules and regulations of the University in the opinion of the Proctor Board, shall be liable for being expelled / rusticated or being denied admission in the next academic session.
12. An applicant may be granted admission to a course of the University even if her/his more than two (02) years might have elapsed since having passed the qualifying examination subject to satisfying his/her other conditions for admission. However, applicants falling in this category shall have to submit an affidavit stating

the reasons for the existing gap in studies to the satisfaction of the competent authorities of the University.

13. Applicants will not be granted admission to the same class as might have been passed by them even with a change in subject(s) studied or school for under graduate classes. This means, for example, that a student who might have passed B.Sc. will not be granted admission to B.Sc. with a different combination of subjects or B.A./B.Com. However, for PG classes, after passing PG in one subject, the applicant may be granted admission in another subject/stream/course only if he/she fulfills all the requirements, eligibility, and merit for admission.
14. Applicants who might have passed the first/second year examination in case of the undergraduate classes and the first-year examination in case of the post-graduate classes as ex-students, may be granted admission to the second/third year of the classes concerned, as the case may be, subject to their fulfilling the minimum eligibility criteria and the availability of seats in the class to which admission might have been sought.
15. Students admitted to the University may avail the facility of studying as regular students for a maximum allowed period as per follows:
  - (a) All UG Programmes, except B.Ed. and B.P.Ed. – Programme Duration + 2 years
  - (b) All PG Programmes, except M.Ed. and M.P.Ed. – Programme Duration + 2 years
  - (c) B.Ed. and B.P.Ed. – Programme Duration + 1 year
  - (d) M.Ed. and M.P.Ed. – Programme Duration + 1 year
16. Students seeking admission to the programmes/courses of the University shall be given weightage for participation in co-curricular activities to be restricted to a maximum of 5 marks in accordance with details specified below:
  - (i) NSS B-Certificate or 240 hours + two Special Camps–1 mark; NSS C-Certificate–2 marks, participation in National Integration Camp/ Republic Day Parade–3 marks (maximum 3 marks in all);
  - (ii) NCC B-Certificate–1 mark; NCC C-Certificate–2 marks; Participation in Republic Day Parade (National)–3 marks; NCC Cadet of the State/National Awardee–3 marks (maximum 3 in all);
  - (iii) Students selected under Youth Festival organized by AIU-Zonal–2 marks, National–3 marks (maximum 3 marks in all);
  - (iv) Participation in sports events organized by AIU-Zonal–3 marks, National–5 marks (maximum 5 marks in all);
  - (v) Position secured in National Competitions organized by AIU or the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs: Individual=First–4 marks, Second–3 marks and, Third–2 marks; Team=First–3, Second–2 and, Third–1 mark (maximum 4 marks in all);
  - (vi) Participation in National Level literacy/cultural/quiz competitions: Individual=First-4, Second–3 and Third-2 marks; Team=First–3, Second–2 and, Third–1 mark (maximum 4 marks in all).
  - (vii) One seat will be offered in each programme for candidates, who have participated in Asian/ Commonwealth/ Olympics Games.
17. Deans of all Schools/Directors of the campuses shall constitute Admission Committees under communication to the University. The constituted Admission Committees shall interview the applicants in persons for the verification of their academic credentials and identity and be responsible for admissions to the undergraduate and such other classes as might be notified/communicated separately and their decision shall be final. The decision of Principal/Campus Director/Deans shall be considered final for all admission related works.
18. The Deans of the Schools/Directors of the campuses shall forward to the various Heads of the departments, a list of the students admitted to the various courses offered by their respective departments under copy to the Dean of Students' Welfare (in respect of all regular and self-financed courses including Professional/Vocational Courses) indicating their category and gender within seven working days of the last date for admissions. Further, the Heads of the Departments shall ensure to place the names of the admitted students in the attendance registers for the various classes of their department. Any admissions made after the communication of such a list shall (except for persons rehabilitated from Kashmir in whose case a relaxation of one month is admissible) be deemed to be invalid.
19. The list of the applicants granted admission to the various classes shall be published and displayed on the

notice board of the concerned School/Campus and the applicants granted admission shall have to deposit their admission and other fees by the date specified in the said list.

20. Students admitted to undergraduate Programme shall not be provided any slip stating the elective subjects allowed to them but the same shall be entered in the fee receipt issued to them and shall also be mentioned in the University Identity Cards provided to them.
21. In the case of all Professional/Vocational Programmes/Courses including the Programmes/Courses offered by the Schools of Law and Education, the Dean of the School/Director of the Campus/Principal of the Affiliated College/Institution concerned shall prepare a list of the applicants admitted finally, indicating their merit position, category, gender, date of birth and the serial number and date of the fee receipt issued to them and submit the same to the University within one month of the last date of admissions and the examination forms of only such students shall be accepted by the University whose names are in the said list.
22. The academic calendar notified by the University shall be applicable to and binding on all the affiliated colleges and institutions without any distinction. However, the reservation rules shall be as per the Central Government policy for the admissions in the University campuses.
23. Admissions to all the Programmes/Courses shall be completed by the University and affiliated colleges/institutions by the last date of admissions notified in respect of each course irrespective of the mode of admissions, i.e., entrance test, counseling or merit. The entrance test, if any, organized by an affiliated college/institution shall be valid only if it might have been supervised by the University.
24. Applicants who have appeared in the final year/final semester examination of the Programmes/Course being studied by them and whose results is awaited may appear in the entrance examination for a course (including the courses offered by the Schools of Education and Law) to which they might be aspiring to be admitted, but, they shall be considered for admission at the time of the final admission interview/counseling only if their final results are declared by then and if they produce a valid mark sheet in respect of the same.
25. Admissions to the Programmes/Courses offered by the School of Law shall be subject to the rules made/communicated by the Bar Council of India from time to time in addition to the admission rules made and notified by the University.
26. Admissions granted to the Programmes/Courses offered by the School of Law shall not be transferable and students admitted to a particular campus or Affiliated College/Institution shall have to complete the Programmes/Course from the same Campus or Affiliated College/Institution.
27. Only such students will be permitted to appear in the Annual/End-Semester examinations for their respective programmes/course and who have submitted their examination forms before the last date notified by the University and have met out the requirement of the mandatory attendance during the academic session.
28. All applicants are advised to note that ragging has been declared to be an unlawful activity and students indulging in ragging are liable to be expelled and prosecuted under law. In compliance of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment in UGC Regulations, it is compulsory for each student and every parent to submit online undertaking every academic year at [www.antiragging.in](http://www.antiragging.in). The student will forward the received mail from anti-ragging website to the Nodal Officer of Anti-Ragging Committee of the University/College.
29. The refund of caution-money/security deposited by a student may be claimed/demanded within one year after passing the final examination of the programme/course taken by her/him. After the expiry of the aforesaid period of one year, the amount deposited as caution-money/security will be forfeited automatically and shall not be refunded.

### **For Applicants from Jammu & Kashmir/Ladakh**

To create two (02) seats under supernumerary quota in all recognized higher education institutions for students from J&K/Ladakh, subject to directions from UGC/MoE/GoI time to time.

## GUIDELINES FOR FOREIGN NATIONALS/NRI/PIO STUDENTS SEEKING ADMISSION TO POSTGRADUATE/ UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

Following are the common rules of the HNB Garhwal University for Foreign Nationals/NRI/PIO - students are required to submit their academic certificates as a proof of passing the qualifying examination for each programme/course to which admission is to be sought. The minimum qualification for them would be same as applicable to the Indian students.

1. Ten percent seats over and above the total number of regular seats in each programme are reserved for the Foreign Nationals/NRI candidates.
2. Foreign Nationals/NRI candidates seeking admission to the concerned programme are required to compete amongst themselves for the seats reserved for them by appearing in the entrance test (wherever applicable) if they are in India. However, those living abroad at the time of entrance test will be exempted from the entrance test.
3. Foreign National/ Non-resident Indian candidates shall have to comply with any other requirements prescribed by the Government of India and HNB Garhwal University from time to time.
4. The candidates seeking admission to B.P.Ed. (Physical Education) will be required to undergo mandatory Physical Efficiency Test. The scores of Physical Efficiency Test will be counted for determining merit.
5. The students seeking admission under University Exchange Programme and wants to complete single semester from the university, shall be exempted from regular fee. The exemption will be applicable for that particular semester.
6. **Tuition Fee:** Tuition Fee structure for Foreign National/PIO/NRI candidates admitted against the seats created for them in teaching Departments will be as per fee structure prescribed by the HNB Garhwal University for Foreign National/PIO/NRI candidates.
7. Besides tuition fee, all Foreign National/PIO/NRI candidates are required to pay one time registration fee as prescribed by the HNB Garhwal University.
8. Further information on the programme/course offerings, rules and regulations, and fee structures are available on the website [www.fsohnbgu.in](http://www.fsohnbgu.in).

## GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION ON THE BASIS OF SPORTS QUOTA

Five per cent (5%) seats (supernumerary) of the total number of seats in each programme are reserved under Sports Quota in the campuses of HNB Garhwal University. All the three campuses will follow the below mentioned guidelines for admission on the basis of Sports Quota. All the applicants applying for admission in this category shall require to meet the eligibility conditions as follows:

1. Applicants as per their age must be eligible to participate in Inter university competitions and should not be employed on Part time/Full time basis anywhere.
2. One who have represented India in the under-mentioned Competition(s), recognized and funded by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) in last three years:
  - a) Olympic Games by the International Olympic Committee (IOC)
  - b) World Championship / World Cup by International Sports Federations (ISFs)
  - c) Commonwealth Games by Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF)
  - d) Asian Games by Olympic Council of Asia (OCA)
  - e) Asian Championships by International Sports Federations (ISFs)
  - f) South Asian Federation Games (SAF) by South Asian Sports Council (SASC)
  - g) World University Games (WUGs) by International University Associations (IUAs).
3. One who have got medal/position in the under-mentioned Competition(s), recognized and funded by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) in last three years:
  - a) Khelo India University Games (KIUG)
  - b) Zone basis/Interzonal Competitions under AIU
  - c) Khelo India Youth Games (KIYG)
  - d) School Games Federation of India (SGFI)
4. Candidates seeking admission under Sports Quota shall be considered for admission only in the games that the university have sufficient infrastructure and facilities i.e., Athletics, Badminton, Baseball, Basketball, Best Physique, Boxing, Chess, Cricket, Cross Country, Football, Handball, Hockey, Judo, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Power Lifting, Shooting, Table Tennis, Tennis, Volleyball, Weight Lifting, Wrestling, Yoga.
5. The admission on the basis of Sports Quota shall be based on direct admission along with fitness certificate certified by Chief Medical Officer, District Hospital at the time of admission.
6. In order to be eligible in Sports Quota, a candidate should have passed the last qualifying examination and submit the Marksheet along with Migration in the university at the time of admission.
7. The admission of the candidates shall be provisional until the verification of sports certificates from the concerned issuing authority.
8. It is mandatory to submit an Undertaking on Non-Judicial Stamp Paper of Rs. 100/- by the applicant at the time of admission stating that he/she will play for the University during their study.
9. In case of more applicants applied than Sports Quota seats, the merit of the qualified candidates for the admission in Sports Quota shall be decided on the basis of certificates of achievements.
10. Applicants shall be considered for Sports Quota only on approval from the University Sports Board.

### Important Notes:

1. The allotment of seat to the eligible applicant shall conform to university regulations and will be the sole responsibility of the Sports Admission Committee of the University which will include:
  - a) Chairperson: DSW/Director Physical Education
  - b) Convener: Assistant Director of Physical Education
  - c) Member/s: Teacher/s, Department of Physical Education
  - d) Game Expert: Internal/External

- e) Vice Chancellor Nominee
2. The Sports Admission Committee of the University shall:
    - a) Screen and collect the application form uploaded by the applicant.
    - b) Verify and Collect Self Attested copy of Merit/Participation Sports Certificate of the applicant.
    - c) Verify and Collect the Self Attested copy of marksheet of 10th, 12th, and any other last year passed examination along with the migration.
    - d) Collect the fitness certificate certified by Chief Medical Officer, District Hospital.
    - e) Collect the Undertaking/Affidavit on Non-Judicial Stamp Paper of Rs. 100/- by the applicant.
  3. In Case of any dispute, it may be resolved by the Sports Admission Committee of the University. The committee decision will be final.
  4. The list of finally selected applicants containing marks of the Sports Certificates, shall be displayed on the Website and Notice Board of the University for three days, to take cognizance of the grievances, if any. The Grievance Committee of the university must resolve all the grievances before admitting the applicants.
  5. The list (soft and hard copy) of finally admitted applicant on the basis of Sports shall be sent to University Sports Board.
  6. The University shall maintain a proper record of the applicants admitted on the basis of Sports Quota.
  7. Sports Certificate of Invitational / Memorial / Open / Prize Money League / Ranking Competitions will not be considered.
  8. Applicants are required to submit Self-Attested copies of the Highest Sports Certificate.

**Extra Perks** – 100% Scholarship for International Players and National Medal winners where their education for the course and hostel accommodation shall be provided free of cost. Other perks shall provide as per University Sports Board guidelines.

## **GUIDELINES FOR PURSUING TWO ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES SIMULTANEOUSLY**

1. A student shall not be permitted to pursue two academic regular programmes simultaneously through physical mode from HNB Garhwal University.
2. A student can pursue two academic programmes simultaneously, one in full time physical mode from HNB Garhwal University and another in Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode either from HNB Garhwal University (if offered) or from other Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) recognized by the UGC/Statutory Council/Government of India.
3. A student can also pursue up to two ODL/Online academic programmes simultaneously, provided at least one must be offered by HNB Garhwal University.
4. A student if pursuing a full-time course (in physical mode) from other HEIs may pursue one ODL course (if offered) by HNB Garhwal University.
5. A student will not be allowed to simultaneously pursue two same programmes in same subject under physical and ODL/Online. For example: A student pursuing B.A. (Political Science and History) in physical mode cannot simultaneously pursue B.A programme with these subjects in ODL/Online mode. The same will apply in case of pursuing two ODL/Online programmes.
6. A student will be solely responsible for the attendance requirements for each programme as stipulated in the respective ordinances. In addition, the student pursuing two academic programmes simultaneously will have no right to request for change in the examination schedule of the programme offered by the HNB Garhwal University.
7. Degree or diploma programmes under these guidelines shall be governed by the Regulations notified by the UGC and also the respective statutory/professional councils, wherever applicable.
8. The student will have to inform the concerned Dean/HoD of the programme offered by the HNB Garhwal University in which he/she is enrolled before simultaneously pursuing another programme in ODL/online mode. HNB Garhwal University will maintain the records of students pursuing two academic programmes simultaneously, of which one of the programme is being offered by the University.
9. These guidelines shall be applicable only to the students pursuing academic programmes other than Ph.D. programme.

**Note:** A student already enrolled in a programme may pursue University-recognized Add-on Courses.

## ATTENDANCE RULES

- (a) The teacher handling a course shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have registered for the course.
- (b) All teachers shall intimate the Head of the Department at least seven calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 75% attendance in one or more courses.
- (c) A candidate who has less than 75% attendance shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination in the course in which the shortfall exists. However, it shall be open to the concerned Dean(s) to grant exemption to a candidate who has failed to obtain the prescribed 75% attendance for valid reasons and such exemptions shall not under any circumstances be granted for attendance below 65%.
- (d) A candidate who fails to put in at least 75% attendance in I semester shall not be allowed to pursue the studies in II semester. Such candidates may apply to the Dean of the concerned school for re-registration in the I semester in the next academic session. A candidate who fails to put in at least 75% attendance in the II semester shall not be promoted to III semester. Such candidates may apply to the Dean of the school for re-registration in the II semester in the next academic session and so on and so forth.

## PASS AND PROMOTION CRITERIA (UG & PG PROGRAMMES)

The following provisions shall be applicable to students admitted to the Four-Year Undergraduate programmes under National Education Policy (NEP 2020):

- (a) A student who appears in an odd semester examination or who was eligible to appear in the odd semester examinations but remains absent in any or all the papers of the said semester, shall move on to the next even semester irrespective of her/his result in the said examinations.
- (b) A student who is unable to earn all the required credits in the previous year(s) may still be considered for promotion, provided that the credits earned in the preceding year(s) are not fewer than the total prescribed credits excluding the credits assigned to any one semester. However, such promotion shall not be automatic and will remain subject to compliance with all other academic, attendance, and examination requirements laid down by the University. In other words, a shortfall equivalent to the credit load of one semester (i.e., an arrear in one semester) is permissible for promotion to the next year, subject to the condition that the student clears the pending credits as per the academic regulations.
- (a) Promotion to VII semester of FYUP (Honours with Research) will be allowed only if the student gets 7.5 CGPA (75 % marks) till successful completion of all 6 semesters.
- (b) Students who do not fulfil the promotion criteria mentioned above shall be declared fail in the promotion examination of the academic year concerned. However, they shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers which they want to retain.
- (c) There will not be any provision of grace marks/grade(s) in any paper /semester exam.
- (d) The candidate obtaining Grade 'F' is considered failed and will be required to clear the arrears in the subsequent examinations within the stipulated time. A student may appear to clear the backlog in the papers prescribed for semester I/III/V/VII only in the odd semester examinations to be held in November-December. A student who wants to appear to clear the backlog in the papers prescribed in even semester II/IV/VI/VIII may do so only in the examinations to be held in May/June.
- (e) The students who remain absent in sessional/end semester examination shall be deemed to have failed in that subject. In case of end semester examination, he/she may reappear in the failed course with maximum three attempts, as back paper examination, provided she/he pays the fees as prescribed by the University. In case of absence in sessional examination, she/he may be permitted to reappear in the corresponding semester category (Odd or Even) in any subsequent academic session, subject to the payment of the prescribed fee and such conditions as may be notified by the University from time to time. This provision shall be applicable only in cases of absence in the sessional/internal assessment and shall not be construed as an opportunity for improvement of internal assessment marks.

- (f) In case of practical examination/Dissertation/Field Reports the internal assessment will be based on the continuous evaluation (viva, performance in class test, maintenance of performance record, etc.) during entire semester. The internal assessment in such cases will be of 30 marks.
- (g) A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible only for CGPA and grade but not for ranking of candidates in the University. Only the candidates who passes all the semester examinations in first attempts are eligible for ranking, when required.
- (h) There shall be no supplementary examinations.

The following provisions shall be applicable to students admitted to the Postgraduate programmes under National Education Policy (NEP 2020):

- (a) A student who appears in an odd semester examination or who was eligible to appear in the odd semester examinations but remains absent in any or all the papers of the said semester, shall move on to the next even semester irrespective of his/her result in the said examinations.
- (b) A student who puts in 75% attendance in I and II semesters of a PG programme separately but fails to acquire 24 credits in I and II semester examinations taken together shall not be promoted to III semester. She/He shall cease to be a regular student.  
Subject to putting 75% attendance in Odd and even semesters, Promotion from odd semester to even semester will be automatic (i.e., from I to II semester and from III to IV semester).
- (c) If a student is unable to obtain the minimum credit requirement for promotion to the next academic year, they may still be eligible for promotion provided that the total credits earned in the immediate previous year are not less than the total required credits minus the credits of any one semester of that year.
- (d) Students who do not fulfil the promotion criteria mentioned above shall be declared fail in the promotion examination of the academic year concerned. However, they shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers which they want to retain.
- (e) There will not be any provision of grace marks/grade(s) in any paper / semester exam.
- (f) The candidate obtaining Grade 'F' is considered failed and will be required to clear the arrears in the subsequent examinations within the stipulated time. A student may appear to clear the backlog in the papers prescribed for semester I/III only in the odd semester examinations to be held in November-December. A student who wants to appear to clear the backlog in the papers prescribed in even semester II/IV may do so only in the examinations to be held in May/June.
- (g) The students who remain absent in sessional/end semester examination shall be deemed to have failed in that subject. In case of end semester examination, she/he may reappear in the failed course with maximum three attempts, as back paper examination, provided he/she pays the fees as prescribed by the University. In case of absence in sessional examination, she/he may reappear in the same semester in the immediate next academic session with a fee as prescribed by the University. Re-appearance in internal assessment for improvement shall not be allowed.
- (h) In case of practical examination/Dissertation/Field Reports the internal assessment will be based on the continuous evaluation (viva, performance in class test, maintenance of performance record, etc.) during entire semester. The internal assessment in such cases will be of 30 marks.
- (i) A candidate who passes the semester examinations in parts is eligible only for CGPA and grade but not for ranking of candidates in the University. Only the candidates who passes all the semester examinations in first attempts are eligible for ranking, when required.
- (j) There shall be no supplementary examinations.

The structure and implementation of the programmes under NEP 2020 are governed by the provisions outlined in the *Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes*, *Curriculum and Credit Framework for Postgraduate Programmes*, the *National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF)*, and the *National Credit Framework (NCrF)*.

## FOUR YEAR BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMME WITH SINGLE SUBJECT (MULTIDISCIPLINARY)

*(Effective for batches admitted from 2026–27 onwards and for the 2025–26 batch from the Second Year onwards)*

### Keywords

**Programme:** An educational programme leading to award of a degree, diploma or certificate.

**Course:** Usually referred to as 'paper' is a component of a programme. All courses need not carry the same weight. The courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures/ tutorials/ laboratory work/ field work/ outreach activities/ project work/ vocational training/ viva/ seminars /term papers/ assignments/ presentations/ self-study etc. or a combination of some of these.

**Semester:** Each semester will consist of 15-18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd semester is from July to December and even semester from January to June.

**Credit:** A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical/field/dissertation work per week. One credit course is equivalent to 15 hours of lectures per semester.

**Lecture (L):** Lecture credits shall be devoted to the delivery of core theoretical concepts, principles, and disciplinary knowledge through classroom instruction, including lectures, seminars, and presentations.

**Tutorial (T):** Tutorial credits shall be allocated for small-group interactions, problem-solving sessions, discussions, remedial teaching, and guided academic exercises aimed at reinforcing concepts introduced in lectures.

**Practical (P):** Practical credits shall focus on hands-on training, laboratory work, fieldwork, project-based activities, or other forms of experiential learning.

### Selection of Major, Minor, and Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) Courses

- In the first semester, students shall select two discipline-specific subjects, namely one Major discipline and one Minor discipline. The Minor discipline may be chosen from a different disciplinary group, subject to the broad disciplinary framework and eligibility conditions prescribed by the University from time to time.
- In addition, students shall opt for Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) courses from a basket of courses offered by a designated discipline or department suggested by the University.
- Accordingly, from the first semester onwards, each student shall ordinarily pursue the following three academic components simultaneously:
  - (i) one Major discipline (Subject);
  - (ii) one Minor discipline (Subject); and
  - (iii) one basket of Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) courses offered by a department.
- The MD/ID courses undertaken during the initial semesters may, subject to fulfilment of prescribed credit requirements, will be considered for progression into an advanced multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary study pathway in subsequent semesters. However, such courses shall not automatically constitute an additional Minor unless specifically provided under the relevant Ordinances or programme structure approved by the University.

### Level of Courses offered under FYUP

**Major Course:** The Major discipline represents the principal area of academic specialization and the degree shall be conferred in this discipline. The student must attain a minimum of 50% of total credits of the programme in a discipline to earn an undergraduate degree with a major in that discipline. It includes both Discipline Specific Core (DSC) Courses, Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses, Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Field visit/Vocational/Internship and Project report related to the Core subject. To earn a degree with a major, students must meet the minimum credit requirements specified for different programme categories.

**Discipline Specific Core Course (DSC-Major):** These are mandatory courses associated with the Major discipline that every student must complete. They provide foundational and advanced knowledge essential to the core subject.

**Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSE-Major):** These are optional/elective courses within the Major discipline, offered as a pool of subject-specific papers. Students are given the flexibility to select courses based on their academic interests or career goals, allowing for a degree of customization within the Major framework.

**Discipline Specific Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses are directly aligned with the core discipline(s) chosen by the student under the FYUP. The skill courses aim to enhance the skills of the students based on the core courses opted by them under the FYUP. These are specialized skill-based courses aligned with the core subjects offered by the departments. Additional skill-oriented courses will also be provided under various categories. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are further available as part of the Minor Course offerings.

**Minor Course:** A Minor discipline provides students with an opportunity to broaden their knowledge and skills beyond their major discipline. It includes additional courses, vocational courses, and other specialized subjects designed to complement the major. A student shall be required to earn a minimum of 24 credits to obtain a Minor during the four-year period of study.

**Discipline Specific (Minor):** The Discipline Specific Minor Courses include a selection of courses from a specific discipline, opted by a student, that meet the credit requirements for the minor. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) will also be offered under the minor courses. 32 credits will be offered under the Discipline Specific Minor in 4-year periods; however, the student must earn a minimum of 24 credits for the award of Minor in Discipline Specific (Minor).

**Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) Subject Specific:** Under the MD/ID category, enrolled students shall have the opportunity to pursue additional courses classified as MD/ID. Maximum 24 credits will be offered under the MD/ID (Minor) and the student will have to earn a minimum of 16 credits. However, for the award of a Minor in MD/ID the student will have to earn 24 credits in the programme duration.

**Additional Courses (Minor):** These courses are offered in addition to the core subject(s) selected by the student at the time of enrollment in the UG Programme. They aim to broaden the academic exposure and skillset of students beyond their primary discipline. Additional courses offered are of two types: An interdisciplinary (ID) course will be of 4 semesters (1<sup>st</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> semester) and the multidisciplinary (MD) course will be of two semesters for each subject as selected by the student (1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup> semester or 3<sup>rd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> semester).

**Interdisciplinary-ID (Minor):** Departments/ subjects which provide Additional courses as Interdisciplinary courses will offer the student an opportunity to pursue the same subject as additional course from first to fourth semester. It means student selecting ID subject in first semester will have to pursue the same subject till 4<sup>th</sup> semester of UG Programme.

**Multidisciplinary-MD (Minor):** Subjects which opt for additional course as multidisciplinary courses will offer the student an option to study multidisciplinary course of one subject in one year (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semester) and that of other subject in another year (3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> semester).

**Other Minor:** Apart from these, the Minor courses may also include a selection of courses from a specific discipline that meet the credit requirements for the minor.

- The concept of Minor is relevant only when there is a Major discipline.
- Students shall have the option to continue pursuing additional courses (Interdisciplinary or Multidisciplinary) as minor course in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semesters of the FYUP.

**Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) are also offered as courses distinct from discipline-specific subjects under the AMSC (Additional Multidisciplinary Skill Courses) and Multidisciplinary (MD-SEC) framework in the first year of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP). Under the AMSC (SECs), University offers six AMSC courses, from which a student may choose any one course. Further, Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) shall be offered under the Multidisciplinary (MD-SEC) category. Each student shall be required to opt for one MD-SEC in the first semester and one MD-SEC in the second semester of the FYUP.

**Additional Multidisciplinary Skill Courses (AMSC):** These courses provide students with the opportunity to acquire skills beyond their core disciplines, promoting a multidisciplinary learning experience enhancing their ability in different disciplines. The University will offer a curated set of AMSCs as an Ability enhancement course to enable students to explore and develop competencies in diverse fields, thereby broadening their academic and professional horizons.

**Value Addition Course (VAC):** These are the courses which are apart from any discipline related courses and aims to add value to the overall personality and development of an individual while focusing on areas such as Community Connect; Understanding and Connecting with Environment; Culture, Traditional and Moral Values, etc. It is compulsory to study all these value-added courses as offered by the University in different semesters.

**Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** Indian Modern Language, Indian Knowledge System and Communication Skills are the courses offered under the AEC. Some of the AEC courses are designed to strengthen students' skill sets

and are categorized as Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) namely Communication Skills, Indian Knowledge System, and other such courses.

**Indian, Modern and Regional Language (IMRL):** Hindi, Sanskrit, English, Odiya & Marathi (Student have to study 2 different languages in the second year with one language in one semester and other language in another semester). One additional course titled “Heritage of Indian Languages” shall be offered, which students may opt for in lieu of any one prescribed language course, subject to the applicable regulations of the programme.

**Vocational Courses:** These courses are designed to equip students with industry-relevant and job-oriented skills through specialized training aligned with the needs of businesses, entrepreneurs, and local industries. Emphasizing learning by doing, they provide hands-on experience through workshops, laboratories, field practice, and skill labs.

**Industrial Visit:** The Industrial Visit course aims to provide students with practical exposure to real-world industrial environments, bridging the gap between theory and practice. It enhances understanding of industrial processes, workplace technologies, and professional ethics, while also developing observational skills and motivating students towards entrepreneurship.

**Field Work:** In addition to providing students with practical, experience-based learning, fieldwork/field visit aims to expose them to real-world socio-economic and societal challenges, allowing them to bridge the gap between theory and practice and develop effective solutions to real-life problems.

**Internship:** The internship aims to bridge classroom learning with real-world experience by developing practical skills, professional ethics, and employability among students. It provides hands-on exposure to industry, research, community, or entrepreneurial settings relevant to the programme of study. Internship may be offered either under the Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) category or in lieu of other Discipline Specific Courses (DSC), subject to the following provisions: a three-month internship shall carry 10 credits, equivalent to 3.33 credits per month. Accordingly, a 36-days internship shall carry 4 credits within a semester.

**Project Report:** The Project Report course aims to cultivate research aptitude, analytical thinking, and academic writing skills among students. It provides hands-on experience in identifying problems, collecting data, and presenting findings systematically. This experiential learning component enhances subject-specific understanding, promotes interdisciplinary approaches, and prepares students for research-based higher education or professional roles in diverse fields.

**Community Outreach Programme:** The curricular component of ‘community outreach’ will involve activities that would expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learnings can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real-life problems.

**Note:** The University reserves the right to revise the programme/course structure or seat allotment in accordance with UGC guidelines or the framework suggested under the NEP and University requirements, as outlined in Admission Prospectuses of the University.

#### Seat Allotment/ Intake in Additional Subject (MD or ID):

The intake of seats for Core Courses will be as mentioned in the Admission Prospectus of the University. Seats under Subjects offering MD and ID course will be as follows:

- (1) Seats under MD/ID Subject: Under the MD/ID subject the number of seats will be Maximum 50 percent of the total seats (Core Seats allocated under the admission for subject) allocated for the Subject/department.

- (2) The MD/ID seats under the Zoology, Botany and Chemistry subjects will be 40 percent over and above the core seats in Birla Campus, Srinagar. The MD/ID seats in Anthropology, Geology, Defence & Strategic Studies may be increased up to 80%, if required)

**Note:**

1. In the case of MD/ ID (Minor), students shall not be permitted to choose or repeat courses that they have already studied at the Higher Secondary (Class XII) level. Student must select their MD/ID (Minor) subject from a subject/course other than the major and minor core subject/courses chosen at the time of admission. A basket of (MD/ID) courses shall be offered under each subject, in alignment with the NEP framework.
2. The MD/ID seats shall be over and above the core seats and shall not be adjusted against the core seats. The University reserves the right to increase the number of seats under the MD/ID, as per academic requirements.
3. Students shall have the option to continue pursuing the same additional course (ID or MD) as minor course in the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semester of the FYUP.

## FYUP (B.A./B.SC./B.COM.) PROGRAMMES

[Excluding B.Tech. and B.Sc. (Forestry & Horticulture) Programmes]

### SELECTION OF DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC MAJOR AND MINOR SUBJECT

Each student shall select one Major and one Minor subject from the following Broad subject group, subject to the prescribed rules and eligibility conditions.

**Broad Groups of Subjects:** The subjects have been classified into eight distinct groups to facilitate more meaningful and academically productive combinations for students. However, selection from these groups remains advisory and flexible, subject to the provisions stated below, allowing students the autonomy to explore multidisciplinary interests.

In the first semester, students are advised to select one Discipline Specific Major and one Discipline Specific Minor Subject, preferably from the combinations within (Group 1, Group 2 and Group 3), or within (Group 4 and Group 5) only. Cross-group combinations outside the limits specified shall not be permitted.

Major and Minor subjects under Groups 6, 7, and 8 shall be offered only within their respective groups, subject to explicit approval of the Academic Council.

### SELECTION OF MULTIDISCIPLINARY/INTERDISCIPLINARY (MD/ID) SUBJECT SPECIFIC

**One MD/ID Subject:** Under this category, each student shall be allotted a basket of courses offered by a designated discipline/subject. The student shall choose any one discipline/subject under which they will study the prescribed basket of courses throughout the programme. The discipline/subject offering the MD/ID courses shall be different from both the Discipline-Specific Major and the Discipline-Specific Minor discipline/subject opted by the student in the first year.

#### Mandatory Conditions

1. The subject offering Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary (MD/ID) courses shall be distinct from both:
  - the Discipline Specific Major Subject, and
  - the Discipline Specific Minor Subject
2. The student must not have studied the same subject or same courses at the 10+2 level.

### SELECTION OF MULTIDISCIPLINARY-SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSE (MD-SEC)

Students shall undertake 03 SECs during the first year of the UG Programme. These courses shall be non-discipline-specific, i.e., not drawn from the student's Major or Minor disciplines. Out of the 03 SECs, 01 shall be chosen from the basket of Additional Multidisciplinary Skill Courses (AMSC) and 02 shall be chosen from the basket of Multidisciplinary Skill Enhancement Courses (MD-SEC).

Of the two SEC-MD courses, one shall be studied in the First Semester and the other in the Second Semester.

## PROGRAMME AND COURSE STRUCTURE

Following two Multidisciplinary Programmes are offered under FYUP in the University:

- Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours/Honours with Research) in ARTS with Single Major (Subject):** Anthropology, Defense Studies, Drawing & Painting, Economics, English, Geography, Hindi, History, Home Science, Mathematics, Music, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Sanskrit, Sociology, Statistics, Education (in affiliated colleges).
- Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours/Honours with Research) in SCIENCE with Single Major (Subject):** Anthropology, Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science, Défense Studies, Geography, Geology, Microbiology, Mathematics, Physics, Statistics, Zoology.

### Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Multidisciplinary)

A four-year Bachelor's degree with Honours shall be awarded upon the successful completion of 176 academic credits, in either of the two programmes. Students will have the flexibility to choose any two subjects within their core disciplines along with the basket of courses offered under a discipline/subject.

A minimum of 88 credits must be earned in the subjects belonging to the student's Major.

### Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree–Honours)

A student enrolled in a FYUP studying two core subjects (Major and Minor) in the first year, and pursuing one of these subjects as the Major in the first, second, third and fourth year, shall be eligible for the award of a Bachelor's Degree with Honours with that Major subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester. This is subject to the condition that the student has earned a minimum of 88 credits (i.e. 50% of the total credits of the programme) in the Major subject out of the total 176 credits required for the programme.

These 88 credits must be accumulated through DSC/CC, SEC related to the Core Subject, DSE, Project report and Field Visit/Vocational/Internship course related to the Major Subject.

### Guidelines for Selecting a Minor in the Fourth Year (7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Semester)

In the fourth year (7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semesters) of the FYUP, students may choose their Minor course from the following:

- A Discipline Specific Core Subject that was studied up to the third year as a minor (i.e., until the 6<sup>th</sup> Semester).
- A Discipline offering a basket of MD/ID courses which the student has opted in the first and second year.

If a student opts for a Minor in a particular subject, they must undertake the Minor courses offered under the same subject in both the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semesters.

### Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree–Honours with Research)

A student enrolled in a FYUP studying two core subjects (Major and Minor) in the first year, and pursuing one of these subjects as the Major in the first, second, third and fourth year, shall be eligible for the award of a Bachelor's Degree with Honours with that Major subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester. This is subject to the condition that the student has earned a minimum of 88 credits in the Major subject out of the total 176 credits required for the programme.

These 88 credits must be accumulated through Discipline-Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core subject, Discipline-Specific Electives (DSE), a project report, field visits/vocational/internship courses related to the Core subject, Research methodology, and a Dissertation on the chosen major subject.

### Guidelines for Selecting a Minor in the Fourth Year (7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Semester)

- One DSC Subject that was studied up to the third year as a minor (i.e., from I to VI semester) *Or*

- MD/ID subject studied during the first and second year

To earn a Minor in a DSC, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the course of the programme. If a student opts for a Minor in a Discipline specific core subject, they must undertake the Minor courses offered under the same subject in both the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Semester.

To earn a Minor in a MD/ ID Subject, a student must accumulate a minimum of 24 credits in that subject over the course of the programme. If a student opts for a Minor in a MD/ ID subject, they must undertake the Minor courses offered under the same subject in both the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Semester.

**Note:** The Departments offering a 4-Year UG Degree (Honours with Research) must have the required infrastructure such as the library, access to journals, computer lab and software, laboratory facilities to carry out experimental research work, and at least two permanent faculty members who are recognized as Ph.D. supervisors. The Departments already recognized for conducting the Ph.D. programme may conduct a 4-Year UG Degree (Honours with Research) without obtaining any approval from the University.

#### Provisions for Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit options and Re-entry options under FYUP

In accordance with the Multiple Entry and Exit provisions outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, students will be offered flexible exit and re-entry options aligned with the corresponding National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF) levels and their respective academic requirements. ### **FOUR YEAR BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMME WITH SINGLE MAJOR (INTERDISCIPLINARY)**

A four-year Bachelor's degree (with Honours) in the aforementioned programmes shall be awarded upon successful completion of 176 academic credits.

#### **Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours)**

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 88 credits in the core subject out of the total 176 credits.

These 88 credits must be accumulated through DSC/CC, SEC related to the core subject, DSE, Project Report and Field Visit/ Vocational/ Internship Course and other courses related to the Major Subject.

#### **Major/Minor under Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research)**

A four-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) in the aforementioned programmes shall be awarded upon successful completion of 176 academic credits.

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and Research with a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 88 credits in the core major discipline out of the total 176 credits.

These 88 credits must be accumulated through DSC/CC, SEC related to the Core Subject, DSE, Project Report and Field Visit/ Vocational/ Internship Course related to the Major Subject, Research Methodology Course including the Dissertation worth 12 credits, aligned with the Core Major Subject.

### **Three Years Under Graduate Programme with Single Major (In Case of Exit)**

#### **Major and Minor under Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (Exit Option after VI Semester)**

A student who chooses to exit the programme after the successful completion of the sixth semester shall be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree, provided they have earned a minimum of 128 academic credits.

A student pursuing a three-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in that discipline, upon exit after the sixth semester. To be awarded a Major, the student must have earned at least 64 credits out of the total 128 credits from the core subject. These credits must be accumulated through DSC/CC and SEC, DSE, Project Report and Field Visit/ Vocational/ Internship course related to the Major Subject. The details are available at:

## INTERDISCIPLINARY PROGRAMMES (B.SC. FORESTRY & B.SC. HORTICULTURE) OFFERED UNDER FYUP

### Bachelor of Science (B.Sc. Honours) Forestry

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Forestry is a four-year undergraduate programme designed with multiple entry and exit options in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP)–2020 and structured as per the recommendations of the ICAR Sixth Deans' Committee. The programme is aligned with the National Higher Education Qualifications Framework (NHEQF), offering progressive certification at different levels: a UG Certificate in Forestry (Level 4.5) after successful completion of the first year, a UG Diploma in Forestry (Level 5.0) after the second year, and the full B.Sc. (Hons.) Forestry degree (Level 6.0) upon completion of the fourth year. The programme shall be offered by the University from the Academic Session 2026–27 onwards.

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Forestry programme requires the completion of a total of 167 credits along with additional 10 credits to be earned from MOCC courses over four years. Students opting for exit after the first or second year shall complete a mandatory 10-week internship following the respective semester. The four-year honours degree shall be awarded upon successful completion of all academic requirements, including the Internship/Student READY component. The total credit structure comprises 100 credits in Major (Core Forestry) courses, 32 credits in Minor/Electives, 12 credits in Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 23 credits in common courses (MDC, VAC, AECC), and 20 credits for Internship/ Project/ Student READY (counted within Major credits), along with 10 credits through MOOCs. Additionally, 4 credits are assigned to compulsory non-gradual components such as Deeksharambh and Educational Tour.

### Bachelor of Science (B.Sc.) Horticulture

The School of Agriculture, H.N.B. Garhwal University (A Central University), Srinagar–Garhwal, offers an Undergraduate Programme in Horticulture in alignment with the recommendations of the ICAR Sixth Deans’ Committee and the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The programme will be offered by the University from the Academic Session 2026–27 onwards.

The B.Sc. (Hons.) Horticulture programme requires the completion of a total of 168 credits over four years. Of these, 101 credits are allocated to Major courses, forming the core disciplinary component of the programme, while 32 credits are assigned to Minor courses to provide academic breadth and interdisciplinary exposure. Together, the Major and Minor components constitute the principal academic framework of the degree, ensuring both depth of knowledge and flexibility in accordance with NEP guidelines. Students opting for exit after the first or second year shall be required to complete a mandatory 10-week internship after the respective semester as per programme provisions.

**Short-Term Skill Course (STSC):** The university will also offer STSC, which will be open to the local community, dropouts, college education candidates not having college education and other aspirants who can do them fulfilling minimum eligibility required for the course for admitting in the course. ### **Four Year Bachelor's Degree (Multidisciplinary Programme)**

A four-year Bachelor's degree with Honours shall be awarded upon the successful completion of 176 academic credits, along with 2 credits in **Self-Study and Development (SSD)**, in either of the two programmes (B.A./B.Sc.) disciplines under the selected programme. A minimum of 88 credits must be earned in the subjects belonging to the student's core discipline.

### **Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours)**

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with two core subjects/disciplines shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and a Major in a particular subject/discipline upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided the student has earned a minimum of 88 credits in that subject out of the total 176 credits. These 88 credits must be accumulated through DSC/CC, SEC related to the Core Subject, DSE and Academic project related to the Major Subject.

### **Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree–Honours with Research)**

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with **two Core Subjects/disciplines** shall be awarded an Honours with Research degree with a Major in one subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 88 credits in that subject out of the total 176 credits. These 88 credits must be accumulated through DSC/CC, SEC related to the Core Subject, DSE and writes dissertation on the chosen major discipline.

### **Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (Exit Option after VI Semester)**

A student who chooses to exit the programme after successfully completing the sixth semester shall be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree, provided they have earned a total of 120 academic credits, including 2 credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD), from any of the multidisciplinary programmes.

A student enrolled with two Core subjects will be eligible for a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree upon successful completion of six semesters, in the event of exiting the FYUP. If the student earns a minimum of 80 credits from the two Core Subjects in the Arts or Science disciplines out of the total 120 credits, they will be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree in Arts or Science discipline, respectively. These 80 credits of core courses must be earned through DSC/CC and SEC related to the two chosen subjects.

### Four Year Bachelor's Degree Programme with Single Major

A four-year Bachelor's degree (with Honours) in the aforementioned programmes shall be awarded upon successful completion of **160 academic credits**, along with **2 additional credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD)**.

#### Major and Minor (Four-Year Bachelor's Degree with Honours):

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 100 credits in the core subject out of the total 160 credits. These 100 credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core discipline, and Discipline Specific Electives (DSE).

#### Major/Minor under Four-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research):

A four-year Bachelor's degree (Honours with Research) in the aforementioned programmes shall be awarded upon successful completion of 160 academic credits, along with 2 credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD).

A student enrolled in a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Honours and Research with a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 100 credits in the core discipline out of the total 160 credits. These credits must be earned through: Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC); Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core discipline; Discipline Specific Electives (DSE) and a Dissertation worth 12 credits, aligned with the core subject

### Three Years Undergraduate Programme with Single Major (In Case of Exit)

#### Major and Minor under Three-Year Bachelor's Degree (Exit Option after VI Semester):

A student who chooses to exit the programme after the successful completion of the sixth semester shall be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor's Degree, provided they have earned a minimum of 120 academic credits, including 2 credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD), in any of the two aforementioned programmes.

A student pursuing a three-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in that discipline, upon exit after the sixth semester. To be awarded a Major, the student must have earned at least 80 credits out of the total 120 credits from the core subject. These credits must be accumulated through Discipline Specific Core/Core Courses (DSC/CC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) related to the core discipline

#### Major and Minor (Four Year Bachelor’s Degree)

A student pursuing a four-year undergraduate programme with a single core subject/discipline shall be awarded a Bachelor’s degree with Honours and a Major in that subject upon successful completion of the eighth semester, provided they earn a minimum of 130 credits in the core subject out of the total 200 credits. These 130 credits must be earned through coursework in DSC/CC, SEC related to the Core discipline, and DSE.

#### Three-Year Undergraduate Degree (B.Voc.) – Bachelor of Vocation (In case of exit)

A student who exits the programme after the successful completion of the sixth semester shall be awarded a Three-Year Bachelor’s Degree (B.Voc.), provided they have earned a total of 156 academic credits, including 2 credits in Self-Study and Development (SSD), in any of the two offered programmes.

A student exiting with a three-year undergraduate degree programme with one Core Subject/discipline will be awarded a Bachelor’s Degree (B.Voc.) in that discipline upon exit after the sixth semester. To be awarded a Major in the subject/discipline, the student must earn a minimum of 98 credits out of the total 156 credits from the Core Subject. These 98 credits must be earned through the following courses- DSC/CC; SEC related to the Core discipline.

## POSTGRADUATE (PG) PROGRAMMES UNDER NEP 2020

The PG will be of 1-Year, 2-Year, and an Integrated 5-Year with multiple entry and exit options after fulfilling the required conditions as per “Curriculum and Credit Framework for Postgraduate Programmes” of University Grants Commission.

**2-Year PG Programme:** Students who did not pursue or are not eligible to pursue the 4-Year Undergraduate Programme (Honours/Honours with Research) will have the opportunity to enroll in a 2-Year Postgraduate (PG) Programme upon completion of their three-year undergraduate degree.

Additionally, students who have completed professional undergraduate degrees, such as B.E. or B.Tech., will have to enroll in a 2-Year PG Programme to pursue postgraduate studies in their respective disciplines.

**1-Year PG Programme:** Students who hold a 4-Year undergraduate degree with Honours or Honours with Research (excluding B.Tech./ B.E. degrees) shall be eligible to enroll in a 1-Year Postgraduate (PG) Programme in their respective or related disciplines.

**5-Year Integrated Programme (UG+PG):** At the PG level, the curricular component of 5-year Integrated Programme will be similar to that of 2-Year PG programme mentioned above.

**NOTE: 1-YEAR PG PROGRAMME IS IMPLEMENTED IN THE UNIVERSITY FROM ACADEMIC SESSION 2026-27.**

**The maximum duration to earn/complete any postgraduate degree will be as follows:**

- a. For 2-Year PG Programme the maximum duration will be four years
- b. For 1-Year PG Programme the maximum duration will be three years
- c. For an Integrated 5-Year Programme the maximum duration will be eight years

### Description of PG Programmes

The PG programmes will be aligned with the NHEQF levels, as detailed below:

<b>NHEQF Level: 6</b>	Postgraduate Diploma: <i>Programme duration:</i> One year (two semesters) for those who exit after successful completion of the first year (two semesters) of the 2-Year Master’s Programme.
<b>NHEQF Level: 6.5</b>	2-Year PG: Master’s degree. (e.g. M.A., M.Com., M.Sc., etc.) <i>Programme duration:</i> Two years (four semesters) after obtaining a 3-Year Bachelor’s degree (e.g. B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. etc.).

(e.g. M.A., M.Com., M.Sc., etc.) <i>Programme duration:</i> One year (two semesters) after obtaining a 4-Year Bachelor’s degree (Honours/ Honours with Research) (e.g. B.A., B.Sc., B.Com. etc.).  5-year Integrated Programme (UG+PG): <i>Programme duration:</i> Five years (ten semesters) after successfully completing secondary education (Grade 12 of school education). <b>NHEQF Level: 7</b>	2-Year PG: Master’s degree (e.g. M.Tech./M.E. etc.) <i>Programme duration:</i> Two years (four semesters) after obtaining a 4-Year Bachelor’s degree (e.g. B.E./B.Tech. etc.).

### Multiple Entry and Multiple Exit

In accordance with the Multiple Entry and Exit provisions outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, students will be offered flexible exit and re-entry options aligned with the corresponding NHEQF levels and their respective academic requirements. The details are available at Link:

### Eligibility for Admission in First Semester of PG Programme

- a) In case of PG programme, no student shall be eligible for admission unless she/he has successfully passed the 3-Year UG or 4-Year UG programme from the University recognized by the Central/State Governments for this purpose or its equivalent.
- b) Minimum pass percentage in pre-PG class for admission in the first semester of PG programme under different caste categories will be as per the recommendations of the admission committee.

### Basic Description of Eligibility for PG Programme

- a) The students having 4-Year UG Degree (Honours with Research/ Honours) will have an option to get enrolled in 1-Year PG Programme.
- b) Those students who have passed 3-Year UG programme and do not opt for/or are not eligible for 4 years UG (Honours/ Honours with Research) will have the option to get enrolled in 2-Year PG programme.
- c) In case of exit after successful completion (securing minimum 48 credits) of first year of the 2-Year PG Programme, the student will get a Post-Graduate Diploma in concerned discipline.

### Learning Mode

Following will be the learning mode in the PG Programme:

- a) All courses may be conducted in blended mode, i.e., 80% offline and 20% online in Master's Degree.
- b) Courses will be taught through Lectures, Tutorials and Practical/ field-based studies.
- c) Departments may offer SWAYAM/ MOOCs Courses, provided the credits from such courses should not exceed the 40% of the total credits under a programme.
- d) Students may opt for MOOC course to earn required or extra credits.

**Note:** The University will have the right to change/modify the/course structure or other information mentioned in prospectus as per UGC guidelines or NEP suggested framework in future.

### ASSESSMENT CRITERIA AND METHODS FOR NON-CGPA COURSES

A non-CGPA course refers to a course whose marks and associated credits are not counted towards the calculation of the student's overall CGPA. A non-CGPA course is one in which the marks and credits earned by a student shall not be included in the computation of the student's overall CGPA; however, successful completion (pass) of such courses is mandatory for the award of the degree.

**Assessment Responsibility:**

**By the Department:** Where a non-CGPA course is offered by a Department, the assessment of students enrolled in the course shall be the sole responsibility of the concerned Department.

**By the Central Committee:** Where a non-CGPA course is offered by the University, the assessment of students shall be the sole responsibility of the Central Committee overseeing the course across university campuses and affiliated Colleges.

**Assessment Criteria:**

- a) Each non-CGPA course shall be assessed for a total of 100 marks.
- b) The assessment methods may include internal examinations, assignments, field reports (with photographic and other evidences, where applicable), or a combination thereof.
- c) The assessment shall be entirely internal and conducted at the level of the Departments/ University Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges, as applicable.

## STUDENT WELFARE

The Dean of Student Welfare Board is headed by the Dean of Student Welfare (DSW), who is assisted by Deputy Dean of Student Welfare in each Campus and several Assistant Dean of Student Welfare. The office of the Dean of Student Welfare is at 1<sup>st</sup> Floor of Student Activity Building in the Birla Campus, Srinagar. The University has provision of services and programmes to support and enhance the overall wellbeing of students. The DSW is responsible for providing need-based assistance to the students and ensuring their general welfare including coordinating number of extra-curricular activities like cultural and sports events, extension, and outreach programmes. The DSW reports to the Vice-Chancellor of the University. Besides providing the basic facilities, the DSW office ensures implementation of many welfare schemes and programmes as follows:

### SCHOLARSHIPS, STUDENTSHIPS AND FREESHIPS

The office of the DSW facilitates the students to avail a number of scholarships/studentships/freeships namely (i) National Scholarship Portal (common portal for various scholarship schemes of Central and State Government); (ii) National Fellowship and Scholarship for Higher Education for ST Students, GoI, Ministry of Tribal Affairs Scholarship Division; (iii) Social Welfare Department of the respective State Governments in which the scholarships are granted to the bonafide students belonging to SC/ST/OBC categories on the basis of the annual income of the applicant's family. Also, the DSW office issues the Bonafide certificate to the students for various purposes.

The University also provides financial assistance to BPL students from the Poor Students Assistance Fee depending upon the total funds available during an academic session. Further, dependents of ex-servicemen are eligible for the scholarship from the Soldier Board of their native district.

### FACILITY OF RAILWAY CONCESSION

The regular students of the University are entitled to get concession in the fare to travel by railways under certain circumstances. The requisite application form for availing this facility may be obtained from the office of the DSW or the Director of the Campus. Duly completed application- form countersigned by the concerned Head of the Department or the Warden should be submitted to the office of the DSW or the Director of the Campus at least 10 days prior to the date of the proposed journey for availing this facility. The purposes for which this fare concession is granted are as under:

1. Traveling to and from home town during long vacations.
2. Participating in educational, sports and cultural events organized or recognized by the Indian Inter University Federation.
3. Educational tours or visiting places of historic, artistic, and cultural importance.
4. Rendering service at times of emergency in the country or participating in collective/group programmes.

### PRADHAN MANTRI VIDYALAXMI (PM-VIDYALAXMI) SCHEME

The PM-Vidyalaxmi Scheme was approved on 6<sup>th</sup> November 2024 by Govt. of India. It is a new Central Sector Scheme to provide financial support to the meritorious students so that financial constraints do not prevent any youth of India from pursuing quality higher education. This will facilitate and drive the extension of education loans to meritorious students who get admission in the top 860 Quality Higher Educational Institutions (QHEIs) of the nation (Indian campus of foreign education institutions, foreign campus of Indian education institutions and foreign education institutions will not be covered under this scheme) translating to covering more than 22 lakh students every year. This is consequent to budget announcement on education loan in the year 2024. Some of the key features about the scheme are mentioned here below:

1. Education loan under PM-Vidyalaxmi scheme is collateral free, guarantor free.
2. Loan applications will be made through a new simple, transparent, student-friendly and entirely digital application process <https://pmvidyalaxmi.co.in>
3. Loan amounts up to ₹ 7.5 lakhs get 75% credit guarantee by the Government of India.
4. Furthermore, for students with up to Rs. 8 lakhs annual family income, the scheme provides for 3% interest subvention on loans up to Rs 10 lakh.

5. This is in addition to the full interest subvention already offered to students with up to Rs. 4.5 lakhs annual family income under Pradhan Mantri Uchchatar Shiksha Protsahan Yojana Central Sector Interest Subsidy (PM-USP CSIS).
6. The Scheme is applicable for all Scheduled Banks/Regional Rural Banks (RRBs)/Cooperative Banks.
7. Students of all family income groups will be eligible to get this education loan, if they so desire.
8. Students admitted through open competitive examinations/merit based admission shall get this loan. Students admitted through management quota (or similar quota) will not be eligible.
9. Bank may take life insurance cover of the student borrower if the loan amount is above certain threshold, to be decided by individual banks. As per request of the borrower, the insurance premium can be included in the education loan amount.
10. If education loan amount is more than ₹ 10 lakhs, interest subvention shall be provided for disbursed total principal amount of loan up to ₹ 10 lakhs only.
11. It may be noted that as per the guidelines of the PM-USP CSIS scheme, students who are pursuing technical/professional courses from approved NAAC accredited HEIs/ NBA accredited courses and whose annual family income is up to ₹4.5 lakhs, shall be eligible for interest subvention during moratorium period (course Period plus one year) for education loan up to ₹ 10 lakhs.
12. Students whose annual family income is between ₹4.5 lakhs and ₹8 lakhs shall be eligible to apply for 3% interest subvention for all degree/diploma courses in the QHEIs.
13. For degree/ diploma courses which are not covered in PM-USP, if the student is studying in the QHEIs covered in PM-Vidyalaxmi, the student will be eligible for 3% interest subvention, if the annual family income of the student is up to ₹ 8 lakhs.
14. Thus, PM Vidyalaxmi and PM-USP will together provide holistic support to all deserving students to pursue higher education in quality HEIs and technical/professional education in approved HEIs.
15. Student availing any other Central/State Government Scholarship or any other interest subvention scheme or Fee reimbursement shall not be eligible for availing benefits under this Scheme.
16. Interest subvention and credit guarantee under this Scheme shall not be available to those students who discontinue their course midstream, or who are expelled from the Institution on disciplinary or academic grounds. However, Interest subvention and credit guarantee would be available only if discontinuation is due to medical grounds for which necessary documentation to the satisfaction of the Head of educational institution needs to be provided.
17. The responsibility of disbursing education loans will be on the respective banks who have sanctioned the loans. The Department of Finance (DFS), Ministry of Finance shall be monitoring the loan delivery by the banks.
18. Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education shall be competent authority for interest subvention and credit guarantee under the Scheme.
19. The Canara Bank shall act as the nodal bank to coordinate the activities of PM-Vidyalaxmi with IBA, member banks and DHE.
20. #### **STUDENTS' COUNCIL**

In pursuance of the provisions of Statute 36 of the First Statutes of HNB Garhwal University 2009, the University is required to constitute a Students' Council in every academic session for providing students with a voice in the academic life of the University. The Students' Council shall consist of:

- (i) The Dean of Students' Welfare who shall be the Chairperson there of;
- (ii) Twenty students nominated by the Academic Council on the basis of meritorious performance in academics, sports and co-curricular activities;

- (iii) Twenty students elected in the manner prescribed by the Ordinances framed under Statute 36. The council shall meet at least twice a year and consider matters of importance to students including programmes of studies, welfare of students and such other matters as may be deemed proper by the Chairperson. The Council shall also make appropriate suggestions to the concerned authorities on matters considered by it. Such students who may not be the members of the Council shall also have the right to bring before the Council matters which might be deemed to be important by the chairperson and shall have the right to be present in a meeting of the Council discussing the same. The affairs and meetings of the Council shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions contained in the ordinances framed under Statute 36.

However, in view of the decision of University Admission Committee Session 2020-21 held on 11.05.2020 the matter related to Student Council will be subject to the directions of UGC/MHRD/GOI from time to time.

### **PROMOTION OF SPORTS**

The University places significant emphasis on the promotion and development of sports and games. To foster sporting activities, a Sports Board has been established, which regularly organizes annual sports meets at both the campus and university levels. University teams selected through these events participate in the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) North Zone and National-level competitions. Eligible sportspersons are also encouraged to compete in the Khelo India Youth Games. Students who achieve excellence in sports are recognized with prizes and certificates. These certificates provide added advantages for admission to higher academic programs within the University and carry weightage in employment opportunities.

### **PROMOTION OF CULTURAL AND LITERARY ACTIVITIES**

The Cultural Committee, comprising members of the Dean Students' Welfare Board and faculty representatives from the University, is responsible for planning, coordinating, and conducting cultural and academic activities across all three campuses of the University. The Committee organizes an Annual Cultural Meet to promote students' artistic, literary, and intellectual talents. Participants selected through these events represent the University at the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) North Zone and National-level cultural competitions.

### **NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)**

NCC training is being imparted to students in the University. The NCC Units of the Campuses come under the State Directorate of NCC in Uttarakhand headquartered at Dehradun. The control of the activities of NCC Units in Birla Campus, Srinagar and SRT Campus Badshahithaul is under 31 UK BN NCC Hardwar. NCC Group Headquarter of these units is at Roorkee. Male students studying in under graduate classes may join NCC and undergo a two-year training programme. NCC 'B' & 'C' Certificate holders are given due preference in admission to higher classes in the University and they are also granted due preference/ reservation in the recruitment to the Armed and Para military forces. Further information in this respect may be obtained from the Associate NCC Officers in the respective Campuses.

### **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)**

The NSS Units in all three campuses of the University gives an opportunity to the students for undertaking social work. The scheme is implemented by Programme Officers working under the supervision of a Coordinator. Students of UG Classes are eligible for registering under the scheme. Students registering in the National Service Scheme have to participate in its activities for 2 years for obtaining the NSS Certificate. Two types of activities namely regular activities and special camps are organized under the scheme. Only such students who put in 120 hours of social work every year under routine activities for two years and attend at least one special camp are eligible for receiving the NSS Certificate. For the present, there are 05 units of the NSS in the Birla Campus, Srinagar; 01 unit in the BGR Campus, Pauri; and 03 units in the SRT Campus, Tehri with an intake of 100 students in each unit. Further details regarding the scheme and the method of registering under the same might be obtained from the Office of the Coordinator of the National Service Scheme in Birla Campus at Srinagar.

### **OTHER ACTIVITIES**

The University actively encourages students to participate in various flagship initiatives of the Government of India, including Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat, Fit India Movement, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan,

Namami Gange Programme, and the Viksit Bharat Youth Parliament. Through participation in these programmes, students develop a sense of social responsibility, national integration, environmental awareness, physical well-being, and active citizenship.

## FACILITIES, SERVICES AND SPECIAL ASSISTANCE

The University provides facilities and services as well as special assistance to students for enabling them to pursue their studies smoothly. Following is a brief description of these facilities:

### HOSTEL ACCOMMODATION

Presently, the University has limited hostel accommodation for the girls and boys studying in the campuses. Therefore, the same is allotted on the basis of merit as well as the reservation policy of the Central Government. ### LIBRARY FACILITIES AND SERVICES

The University has a well-endowed lending library system consisting of a network of departmental and campus libraries supported by a central library located on the Birla campus in Srinagar. The Library system has more than 5.81 lakhs printed documents, 2.66 lakhs e-books, 17425 e-journals, including 13806 e-journals covered under One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) w.e.f., 1st January 2025), 4 databases (SCOPUS, IndiaStat, Manupatra, CMIE Economic Outlook), 3 Anti-Plagiarism Softwares (iThenticate, CheckForPlag, Drillbit), writing tool (Grammarly), Qualitative Data Analysis Tool (NVivo 15), Quantitative Data Analysis Tool (SPSS Statistics 31), KIBO 2.0 (AI-powered Document Transformation System).

The subscribed e-resources can be accessed within the IP Ranges of the libraries without any login credentials. These e-resources can be accessed remotely (Off-Campus Access) and through a single-window search with the help of the HNBGU E-Library (<https://hnbgu.knimbus.com/>) (through the KNIMBUS Platform) and mobile app (mLibrary) around the clock and worldwide with the login credentials provided by the Central Library. Central Library is a member of the Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET), Ahmedabad, Developing Library Network (DELNET), New Delhi, National Digital Library of India (NDLI), IIT Kharagpur and Sugmaya Pustkalaya, New Delhi.

The Central Library is using KOHA Integrated Library Management Systems (ILMs) along with RFID system. The ILMs is also capable of a web-based user-friendly interface and Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) cum Library Website (<https://library.hnbggu.ac.in/>), which can be accessed globally and around the clock. The One OPAC terminal is available at the Central Library, Srinagar and Chauras Library for searching the books by the Library Users. The Central Library, Srinagar, has a Digital Lab where 20 computers are available for the students to browse and search the e-library, e-resources procured by the HNBGU Library System.

### **MEDICAL FACILITIES**

The University's Health Centre at Birla Campus, Srinagar is equipped with Four Bed Emergency Ward and a Dressing Room along with Ambulance Service. The Health Centre started in 1997 and was permanently established in 2004. The aim of the centre is to ensure the physical and mental well-being of the university community. It caters to the needs of all students and staff including regular check-ups, treatment of common diseases and providing medicines for general ailments. Facilities for Blood Sugar Test, Blood Pressure measurement, Haemoglobin Testing, Nebulizer compressor system, Oxygen concentrator, and T.T. vaccine is available in the Health Centre. Medicines are available free of cost to students and staff. Besides these the centre conducts blood donation camps time to time.

Health services are also being provided at the SRT Campus, Tehri, whereas, at BGR Campus, Pauri a position of Medical Officer is sanctioned.

The office works in coordination with the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR), the Ministry of External Affairs, the Ministry of Education, as well as various embassies and consulates, particularly for scholarships and the implementation of MoUs with international partner institutions. It also acts as a liaison between students, university departments, diplomatic missions, and relevant government agencies in India and abroad.

Hemvati Nandan Bahuguna Garhwal University offers a multicultural and interdisciplinary academic environment, along with an affordable cost of living and a supportive learning atmosphere. International students are also encouraged to actively participate in extracurricular activities alongside their academic studies.

All students are required to abide by the Code of Conduct outlined below. Any violation of the Code of Conduct shall be treated as a breach of discipline and may invite disciplinary action in accordance with University rules and regulations. Students are therefore advised to uphold a congenial academic environment and foster harmonious relationships among all stakeholders of the University.

It is mandatory for the students to submit their details duly filled in the prescribed form provided to the Proctor office. In compliance of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment in UGC Regulations, it is compulsory for each student and every parent to submit online undertaking every academic year at [www.antiragging.in](http://www.antiragging.in). The student will forward the received mail from anti-ragging website to the Nodal Officer of Anti-Ragging Committee of the University/College.

### THE CODE OF CONDUCT

#### Clause-1

#### Curbing Indiscipline and Misconduct by Students

The following acts on the part of students, individually or collectively, or in a group of two or more students or persons, shall amount to indiscipline and misconduct:

1. Physical assault, threat to use physical force, or any other intimidating behavior, within the premises of institution of the University system, or of any unit of any such institution, against any teacher, officer, functionary, member of any authority or unit, or other body, member of the non-teaching staff, or student of any such institution or unit, or a visitor present on official invitation or for administrative or academic work in such premises.
2. Causing disruption or disturbance in any manner in the teaching and other academic work, the working of libraries, laboratories, facilities and amenities, admission and examination processes, administrative working, and in any institution of the University system or any unit of such in situation.
3. The use of loudspeakers or any other sound amplification device in the premises of any institution of the University system, except where the proctor (in the case of the University) or functionary responsible for the maintenance of discipline (in the case of any such institution other than the University) has permitted such use for any educational, academic, co-curricular, literary, cultural or other extracurricular event.
4. Unruly and disorderly behavior during the course of any educational or academic excursion or tour, or at any event or competition relating to curricular, co-curricular or literary, cultural, sports or other extracurricular activities, or other social, educational or career-related programmes organized by, or in, any institution or more than one institution, of the university system, or any unit of such institution, whether within or outside the premises of any such institution or unit.
5. Any disobedience of, or dissent against, the awards or decisions of Referees, Umpires, Judges, or other adjudicators, officiating at any event or competition referred to in sub-clause (3).
6. Any act or statement, or distribution or display of any document or literature, including the circulars, pamphlets, posters, press releases, etc., which adversely affects the public image of any institution of the University system, or of any unit thereof, or of any individual belonging to, or associated with, such institution or unit.
7. The possession and distribution of objectionable goods or materials.
8. Any act that creates, or tends to create, ill-will between groups of persons or promotes intolerance on religious, social, regional, or linguistic grounds.
9. Any act violative of the provision of the statutes, the ordinances or the Regulations of the University, or of the rules made there under.
10. The possession, display, use or threat of any weapon.
11. Any act that interferes with the personal liberty of another person, or subjects other persons to indignity, or involves physical violence or use of abusive language. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976.
12. Any violation of the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes.

13. Any act or practice, whether verbal or otherwise, that is derogatory of women or amounts to sexual harassment.
14. The making of false statements or the submission of false documents.
15. The use of the title of the University, or of any institution of the University system, or of any unit of such institution, for any organization or event, or in any communication or representation, without entitlement to such use, or for purposes not specifically authorized by the concerned institution or unit.
16. Any attempt at bribery or recourse to any corrupt practice, in any manner.
17. Any act that causes any loss, destruction, or defacement of the property of any institution of the University system or of any unit of such institution.
18. Any act amounting to unauthorized presence in, or entry or trespass into specified premises and areas, and any unauthorized retention or premises, of any institution of the University system or of any unit of such institution.
19. Any act that causes, encourages, or implies the interference of outside persons, organization or authorities in the functioning of any institution of the University system or of any unit of such institution.
20. Unauthorized collection of funds.
21. Possession, distribution or consumption of alcoholic drinks, intoxicants, narcotic drugs, and other psychotropic substances, and presence in the premises of institution of the University system or of any unit of such institution after such consumption
22. Any act involving moral turpitude
23. Any other act that is, in the opinion of the officers or functionaries of the university or any unit of the University system, unbecoming of a student
24. Any act of resorting to or abetting ragging, as defined in Clause 2.
25. Students shall avoid using cell-phones in the Campus; while, listening to music and sharing visuals on cell-phones or other electronic devices in the Campus is strictly prohibited.

#### **Clause-2**

#### **UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in the University**

In view of the UGC Draft regulations 2009 and Supreme Court of India's letter No. 370/04/XIA dated 26 February, 2009 and March 17, 2009 the following provisions have been made by the University to curb ragging effectively in its campuses.

Ragging means the following:

Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause embarrassment, annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such students will not in the ordinary course do or perform and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student. Any of the above acts committed by any student of the same or junior or senior class shall be deemed to be ragging.

#### **1. Punishable ingredients of ragging**

- \* Abetment to ragging;
- \* Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- \* Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- \* Public nuisance created during ragging;
- \* Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- \* Causing bodily harm, or injury or grievous injury;
- \* Wrongful restraint;
- \* Wrongful confinement;
- \* Use of criminal force;
- \* Assault as well as sexual offences or even unnatural offences;
- \* Extortion;
- \* Criminal trespass;

- \* Offences against property;
- \* Criminal intimidation.

Attempts to commit any or all of the abovementioned offences against the victim(s); all other offences following from the definition of "Ragging".

## 2. Punishment

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti Ragging Committee of the Institution, the possible punishment for those found guilty of ragging at the institutional level; shall be any one or the combination of the following:

- \* Cancellation of admission.
- \* Suspension from attending classes.
- \* Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits
- \* Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process
- \* Withholding results.
- \* Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet.

## 3. Tournament, Youth festival, etc.

- \* Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel
- \* Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- \* Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution
- \* Fine of Rupees 25,000/-
- \* Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

### Clause-3

#### Establishment of Identity and Certification of Character

1. Every bonafide student of the University, irrespective of the Campus to which she/he might have been admitted, will be issued an Identity Card by the Office of the Proctor. The Identity Card issued to a student shall be treated to be the sole proof of her/his being a student of the University. It shall be mandatory for every student to produce the Identity Card upon being demanded by a member of the Proctorial Board. Failure in producing the Identity Card on demand will cause a student to be treated to be a trespasser and render her/him punishable under the rules of the University. The loss of the Identity Card should be reported to the Office of the Proctor and a duplicate Identity Card should be obtained from the said Office by making a formal application accompanied by a photocopy of the Fees Receipt issued to the student concerned at the time of admission and depositing the prescribed fees.
2. Character Certificates are issued to students on demand by the Proctor's Office. Often students applying for employers are required to submit an appropriate Character Certificate. The Character Certificate issued under the seal of the Proctor is considered to be the most appropriate proof of character. The students can be issued a Character Certificate as many times as they may require upon making a written application and the payment of the prescribed fees. However, students who might have been 'blacklisted' or might have been punished for a breach of the Code of Conduct or might have been guilty of indulging in ragging shall not be issued a Character Certificate.
